SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR 2021 – 2022

C.P.R. Environmental Education Centre (CPREEC) is a Centre of Excellence in Environmental Education. Due to the prevailing COVID pandemic and lockdown, programmes of CPREEC were mostly conducted online. CPREEC managed to carry out the following activities from April 2021 to March 2022.

World Environment Day

World Environment Day was observed on June 5th and CPREEC ENVIS –RP, Chennai designed and released a poster on Ecosystem Restoration. Dr. Nanditha Krishna, Honorary Director, CPREEC, delivered an online lecture on 'Our Food and Climate Change' emphasizing the necessity of Ecosystem Restoration through Zoom meeting.

Sustainability Education Programme for Schools

CPREEC implemented the WIPRO Earthian Sustainability Education programme for Schools funded by WIPRO Foundation, Bengaluru in the states of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Goa and the Union Territories

of Puducherry and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

The prevailing situation in April – June 2021 in the country under the second wave of COVID-19 pandemic forced CPREEC to restrict the delivery of programme only through non-direct mode. In agreement with the Wipro Foundation, the launch of earthian programme in six states and the workshops/orientation for the teachers were planned and delivered through online method using the tools of ICT.

Five CPREEC network schools won the prestigious National Earthian Awards this year and six CPREEC network schools were shortlisted.

CPREEC - ENVIS Resource Partner (RP) on Conservation of Ecological Heritage and Sacred Sites of India

CPREEC's ENVIS Resource Partner (RP) on "Conservation of Ecological Heritage and Sacred Sites of India" of the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change is involved in collecting, collating and disseminating information. The portal was regularly updated.

Green Skill Development Programmes (GSDP)

CPREEC RP organized four certificate courses, two each at Gudalur, The Nilgiris and at Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, as part of the Green Skill Development Programmes (GSDP) of the MoEF&CC.

Go Veg Programme

With the financial support extended by Humane Society International (HSI), CPREEC implemented the project in Chennai and Nilgiris district in Tamil Nadu, Vijayawada in Andhra Pradesh, Tumakuru and Bangalore Rural districts in Karnataka and Khordha district in Odisha. Teachers training programmes and students orientation programmes were conducted. Painting competitions on Kindness to Animals were held, prizes and certificates were distributed to the winning students.

Food & Environment – Eat Healthy & Go Green

The project was implemented highlighting importance of veganism in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Odisha, and Tamil Nadu with financial support extended by Karuna Foundation. The

resource material *Go Veg – Eat Healthy* in English and regional languages were distributed to participants during the workshops conducted in the above states. Programmes for teachers, teacher trainees, college and school students, women and youth were conducted. Vegan cooking workshops were also organized for women in the state of Karnataka and Odisha.

Sacred Grove Conservation

Sacred Grove conservation is one of the important programmes of CPREEC since 1994. The sacred groves of Nenmeli and Kunnam in Kancheepuram district are being maintained. Casualty replacement of plants was also carried out at the above sites.

Smart Schools



The items were installed at the schools and basic training was provided to the teachers. A formal handing over ceremony was organized at all the schools in the presence of senior officials from Expleo Solutions Ltd.



WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

World Environment Day (WED) is celebrated every year on June 5. This year's WED's theme was 'Ecosystem Restoration'. C.P.R. Environmental Education Centre (CPREEC) has been restoring degraded sacred groves in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu as part of the 'Awareness through Action' programme initiated in 1994. The Sacred groves that are endangered or in near extinction condition and are in need of restoration are identified and selected by CPREEC for restoration. Appropriate species suitable to the area were selected and planted with the cooperation of local villagers.

So far, CPREEC has restored 53 sacred grove sites in the states of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka with




a total area of 192 acres and have planted more than 2.00 lakh saplings.



Objective of the programme

- ❖ To promote sustainable thinking
- To train teachers and students on the environmental challenges faced by the country
- To transfer and acquire environmental skills based on the Earthian knowledge building activities

As per the programme plan proposed and agreed, eighteen (18) online virtual workshops for teachers were organized in five (5) states (Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Goa, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana) and two (2) Union Territories (Puducherry and Andaman & Nicobar Islands). CPREEC headquarters and its state offices requested the educational institutions and the Departments of Education/State Councils of Science and Technology for the deputation of school teachers to the online events. Official permissions were obtained and as per the Standard Operating Procedure (SoP), web conferencing events were organised and conducted. The protocol and requirements of collaborating agencies were met in executing the workshop for teachers.

The participants were requested to register for the workshops scheduled through Google Form Registration links sent along with the deputation orders, WhatsApp groups and emails. The WhatsApp groups were formed at state or district level to support the vernacular/regional language interactions. The thematic experts, academicians and the department officials were also part of the

groups in facilitating and guiding the teams. The major aim of the virtual workshops was to familiarise the three thematic areas of earthian (Biodiversity, Water and Waste) to the teachers and their project teams.

Resource Materials

Since the earthian workshops for teachers were delivered remotely through the web based conferencing, the earthian resource manuals for the teachers/ schools/ project teams were circulated predominantly as soft copies through emails, WhatsApp groups, compact discs and through the district level coordinating officials. The Wipro Foundation provided printed English versions of the manuals to CPREEC. The printed versions were also selectively given to the potential project teams through India Post, courier service.

Project Follow-Up and Team Facilitation

The orientation programmes on earthian thematic areas were followed by the project facilitation events and special thematic interactions with the teachers and students. CPREEC with its state and regional offices facilitated the earthian activities by meeting the teams through online Cisco Webex web conferencing, WhatsApp groups, emails and telephone calls. In some instances, where the SoP allowed earthian team to meet the student groups, Cluster Conferences, open houses, expert guide talks and scheduled earthian virtual conclaves organized periodically were encourage, guide and nurture earthian project teams. The facilitation events were carried out in local, state and regional levels.







6 GO VEG PROGRAMME

With the financial support extended by Humane Society International (HSI), CPREEC implemented the Go Veg Programme in the cities of Chennai and Ooty in Tamil Nadu, Vijayawada in Andhra Pradesh, Tumakuru and Bangalore Rural Districts in Karnataka and Khordha in Odisha.

The resource material on Go Veg. was designed, translated, printed and distributed to the teachers and students in Tamil, Telugu, Kannada, Odiya and English.

Teachers training programmes and students orientation programmes were conducted in collaboration with the concerned State Education Department. Four workshops covering 285 teachers were organized. Eminent resource persons explained in detail the harmful effects of consuming non vegetarian food and the natural resources depleted in producing them. They also shared the various cruelties faced by the broiler chickens, transportation of chickens and slaughtering is very cruel. The teachers were requested to convey the goodness of vegetarian food among their children for a healthy living.



7 FOOD & ENVIRONMENT – EAT HEALTHY & GO GREEN

The project was implemented in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Odisha and Tamil Nadu with the financial support extended by Karuna Foundation. The resource material Go Veg – Eat Healthy in English and regional languages were distributed to the participants during the workshops conducted in the above states.

CPREEC's state and field offices at Ooty in the Nilgiris in Tamil Nadu, Tumakuru in Karnataka, Vijayawada in Andhra Pradesh and Bhubaneswar in Odisha organised the programmes.

Programmes were conducted mainly for the teachers, teacher trainees, college and school students, women and youth on eating healthy food, veganism, ill-effects of non-vegetarian food to human and the environment, animal cruelties, etc. Vegan cooking workshops were also organised for the women to promote vegan diet.

The staff of CPREEC in all the above cities gave a brief introduction to the workshop. The invited resource persons highlighted the importance of vegan diet and the numerous health benefits. They attributed that the change in lifestyle and food habits is the root cause for several health issues among the younger generation. They requested the participants to consume plant based diet and to avoid dairy and nonvegetarian food. They also requested the participants to grow greens and green vegetables in their backyard if they have space. All the participants of the workshops were provided with herbal tea and vegan food.

8 SACRED GROVE CONSERVATION

Sacred Grove conservation is one of the important programmes of CPREEC since 1994.

The Sacred groves that are endangered or in near extinction condition and are in need of restoration are identified and selected by CPREEC for restoration. Appropriate species suitable to the area were selected and planted with the cooperation of the local villagers.

The sacred groves of Nenmeli and Kunnam in Kancheepuram district are being maintained. Casualty replacement of plants was also carried out at the above sites. Incidentally, this year's theme for World Environment Day (June 5) was 'Ecosystem Restoration'. CPREEC has been restoring degraded sacred groves in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. So far, CPREEC has restored 53 sacred grove sites in the states of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka with a total area of 192 acres and have planted more than 2.00 lakh saplings.

This year, CPREEC's ENVIS – RP has documented 27 sacred groves in India with a total of 10,377 sacred groves.



9 SMART SCHOOLS


